Centralized data improves care!

Overview

Superior HealthPlan Network's Health Passport is a web-based, secure health information tool built using core clinical and claims information to deliver relevant healthcare information when and where it is needed for the Foster Children in the state of Texas.

Using the Health Passport, providers and service coordinators can improve care coordination, eliminate waste, and reduce errors by gaining a better understanding of a person's medical history and health interactions as the person progresses through the clinical process. Medical Consenters, appropriate DFPS and HHSC staff, participating providers, and Superior HealthPlan Network as well as Integrated Mental Health Services clinical staff will have access to detailed member health information.

Features

Once securely accessed, the Health Passport presents the authorized user with information including:

- Medications** – The Health Passport presents a summary of medications filled. With a single click providers can access more detail, including the name of the prescription, the prescribing clinician, date filled, and dosage. The aggregation of medication information can significantly reduce incidents of drug-drug, drug-allergy, and drug-food interactions.
- Visit History** – With the Health Passport, application users can view past visits that illustrate the description of the service, treating provider, diagnoses and the service date.
- Vital Signs** – Providers can use interactive documentation to chart vital signs in the Health Passport at the point-of-care. This information is then viewable to all application users.
- Lab Results** – Providers typically only have lab results for tests that they ordered. However, by using the Health Passport providers have access to all Quest lab results. All application other application users will also have access to view this information.
- Immunizations** – This section displays a comprehensive list of a person's immunizations collected from ImmTrac.
- Allergies** – Providers can use interactive documentation to chart allergies at the point-of-care. Once an allergy is charted, Health Passport instantly checks the allergy for medication interactions. All application users can view this information.
- Electronic Documentation** – Providers can document Texas Health Step, Dental, and Behavioral forms within the Health Passport. Additionally, they may mail or fax in documents critical to patient care for display. All application users can view this information.
- Patient Demographics** – Easily locate a Foster Childs, demographic, medical contact, and personal contact information.
